



What Can Be Inspected Under PIPA?

All inflatable equipment which is used for 'hire & reward' must be routinely inspected by a competent person under health & safety law. The PIPA scheme helps you achieve this by providing assurance that its inspectors are competent to inspect inflatable devices. Not all inflatables can be inspected under the PIPA at this moment in time. However, PIPA continues to expand its scope and this information will be updated as more device types fall under the scheme.

The diagrams below are an indication of what inflatables can and can't be tested via the PIPA scheme.

Non Ride-On Games:


Inflatable games which a person does not have to get onto, into or inside the device in order to participate. The user is able to come into contact and interact briefly. They are of a constant air design, and not sealed air units.

Examples Include:


